## **HORTICULTURAL SECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. **IMPORTANT:** Vehicles carrying more than 6 entries may enter the showground. Please ask Horticultural Secretary for a vehicle registration that must be displayed. Vehicles must be moved to public car park by **9am**.
2. **Exhibitors MUST buy a Show Entry ticket at the gate on entering the Show Ground. One entry ticket will be issued to an exhibitor or a family group who enter 10 or more entries.**
3. **Entries must be received by 10pm on Saturday 24th August 2024.**
4. Fees for classes are 50p per entry paid on the day, before staging.
5. **WE ARE UNABLE TO ACCEPT ENTRIES ON SHOW DAY.**
6. **Each Exhibitor can only have 1 entry per class.**
7. All exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and in accordance with the rules. Vegetables, Fruit, and Flowers except Floral Art must be grown on own land or allotment. An Exhibitor not conforming shall be disqualified.
8. A prize will be awarded even if 1 entry. The Judge's decision is final.
9. **Only exhibitors should enter the Tent with their exhibits which must be staged before 9.30am on morning of the Show.**
10. The Show marquee will be cleared by 9.40 am on the morning of the Show except for Stewards and Secretary. Judges will arrive at 09.50 am.
11. Any Exhibitor proved guilty of fraudulent practice shall forfeit all prizes and be barred from future Shows if the Committee so directs.
12. Complaints of an exhibit not conforming to rules or schedule, must be made by 2pm on the day with 50p deposit, refunded if complaint is upheld.
13. The Committee reserves the right to deal with matters not covered by the rules.
14. While taking all reasonable care the Committee does not hold itself responsible for damage to, or loss of exhibits.

## Exhibiting Your Entries.

1. On entering tent, pay for your class entries at the Horticultural Tent desk. Entry cards will then be given to be placed by the relevant exhibit.
2. Paper plates are available if needed.
3. Stewards can advise exhibitors when staging their exhibits, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure their entry conforms to schedule.
4. Exhibits should be staged as attractively as possible. Quality and uniformity are more important than size.
5. Exhibitors are only allowed to move their own exhibits.
6. Stewards may move any exhibit:
  - a) Before judging, as necessary to make room for other exhibits.
  - b) After judging, as necessary to present an attractive and well-balanced show bench to the public.
7. After staging and before leaving the tent, exhibitors must check that their entries are in accordance with the schedule.
8. Each entry card must be placed by the appropriate exhibit.
9. **Exhibits can only be removed when the bell is rung at 4pm**

**15 minutes will then be given for Exhibitors to remove their exhibits unless the Exhibits are to be left for Auction at 4.30pm.**

51. 2 vegetarian savoury pasties – any flavour
52. 1 loaf made in a bread maker, made with yeast
53. 6 Cheese Straws
54. Gluten-free cake – any flavour
55. 2 scotch eggs

## **Men and Boys Class**

56. “Chocolate Cake” 8in/20cm round with filling. Judge on appearance and taste.
